One week before trial, counsel and pro se parties are to file with the court at the Clerk's Office on pleading paper a <u>joint</u> trial management conference report providing the following information:

- 1. A joint brief, non-argumentative description of the case.
- 2. A joint list of issues which are in dispute.
- 3. A joint list of pending motions, pending requests for discovery and proposed motions in limine.
- 4. A list of exhibits reasonably expected to be introduced by each party, indexed by P plus number for plaintiff(s) and by D plus number for defendant(s). The list shall briefly describe each exhibit and indicate whether any party objects to the admission of such exhibit and the grounds for such objection. Counsel shall mark all exhibits as full exhibits or for identification prior to the commencement of trial.
- A list of all witnesses reasonably expected to be called by each party in sequence in which they will be called, including the name and the relationship of each witness to the case (e.g. party, eyewitness, expert) and whether there is a scheduling problem as to the testimony of any such witness. Rebuttal witnesses, i.e., those whose testimony is meant to rehabilitate, explain, qualify, negate or contradict that which has been presented during the defendant's case, need not be listed by the plaintiff. Likewise, surrebuttal witnesses, i.e., those whose testimony is meant to refute the plaintiff's rebuttal evidence, need not be listed by the defendant.
